So as we understand the consultation – no street trading permits will be needed at all to trade on non prohibited streets in East Suffolk ?

Which will offer an annual saving to us but what will happen if there are 3 ice cream vans in one street at a time? – I appreciate laws of probability it's unlikely but there is a possibility it could happen...I imagine it's first come first served but there could possibly be disagreements during peak season and outside schools etc.

We also feel this could open doors to so called rogue traders who may not be food hygiene registered with the local council, will there be an obligation for businesses to register with East Suffolk even though no street trading fee will be due? Where will the line be drawn, will we see burger/takeaway vans driving onto residential streets and trading if this consultation is passed?

I note the section of letter which says "the council is therefore now consulting on the proposal to introduce a policy whereby the district just has selected prohibited streets where no street trading can take place at all. The remainder of the streets in the district would not be subject to regulation although the permission of the landowner and/or Highways England will need to be obtained"

We accept there are prohibited streets and if we trade on private property/pre arranged events land owner will give permission for us to be there – can you advise in what scenario permission would be needed from Highways England?
