- All CP's overcame challenges of Covid to remain active and meet virtually
- All CP's made progress <u>delivering their priorities</u>
- £151,687.15 committed to projects across all eight CP's to date
- 120 projects planned, completed or underway across all eight CP's
- Benefit of work commissioned from SALC to engage with Town and Parish Councils
- Relatively low engagement from businesses and voluntary organisations
- Positive publicity increasing but low levels of awareness of CP's amongst residents





Embed the Community Partnerships as <u>the</u> place to do place-based partnership work



Peer Review Action Plan.

The first phase is structured around three priorities:

- 1. Each CP needs to RESET after lockdown:
 - Review / refresh priorities
 - Produce a focussed Plan of what they will deliver
 - Set SMART outcomes
- 2. Each CP needs to equip itself to deliver its plan:
 - Build confidence to take a proactive problem-solving approach
 - Engage the right people to get the job done
 - Gain the necessary skills to perform the task well
- 3. We must all communicate what we do:
 - Between CPs to share best practice
 - Internally within ESC to embed the process
 - Externally to promote the benefits of CPs to our residents



Establish a programme of activity to address the data-led priorities identified at East Suffolk and individual CP level



- CP's continued to meet virtually challenging to maintain momentum and engagement
- Many CP's successfully use Task and Finish Groups between meetings
- Heavy Reliance on Grant Schemes
- New "East Suffolk Profile" presented to the Board in December 21
- New data packs being rolled out for each of the eight community partnerships some limitations to depth and timeliness of data
- CP's began meeting face to face from February to refine their priorities



Establish the Community Partnership Board as a strategic forum to effectively and collaboratively problem solve key challenges for East Suffolk



In 2021-22:

- Board met four times, engagement has remained high, and membership is complete except Youth Voice representation
- New priority emerged at both individual CP and East Suffolk level – focus on Financial Inequality
- Four multi-agency Task Groups have worked between meetings to develop programmes and projects to tackle each priority
- Seven of these <u>Programmes or Projects</u> received Board funding

Annual Forum, Trinity Park Conference Centre, 25 March 2022

Attendance

- 211 delegates
- 12 x 60 minute workshop / seminar sessions (each delegate attended two)
- 10 delegates attended the additional breakfast session aimed at businesses
- 30 organisations hosted a stall in the 'market place'
- Three organisations had their project vehicles on display outside

Delegate Feedback

- 100% respondents found the event useful overall to some extent
- 100% respondents found the networking useful to some extent
- 100% respondents shared information and knowledge on challenges and opportunities in East Suffolk
- 92% respondents will change the way they work as a result of attending
