1.	Welcome from the Chairman, Introductions and Apologies
	The Chairman, Councillor Jenny Ceresa, welcomed everyone to the meeting and it was noted that apologies for absence had been received from SCC Cllr Tony Goldson and Cllr Jenny Sheahan (Mutford PC).
2.	Appointment of Vice-Chairman
	Jenny C nominated Michael Ladd to become the Vice-Chairman for the remainder of this Municipal Year and this was seconded by Craig. It was noted that there were no other nominations.
	AGREED: That Michael Ladd be appointed as the Vice-Chairman for the remainder of this Municipal Year.
3.	Notes of the Last Meeting
	The notes of the last meeting held on 5 August 2020 were agreed.



4.	Community Partnership Board Update
	Nicole Rickard gave an update report from the Community Partnership Board meeting held on 7 September 2020. In relation to the Grandpads, it was noted that 25 extra devices had been funded by the Board and an order had recently been placed for 50 devices so anyone with any suggested recipients was asked to contact the Communities Team. She also stated that the Task and Finish Group had met again to discuss vulnerable people and places and their proposal for EAST boxes would be considered at the next Board meeting. It was noted that EAST (Everyone Active, Supported, Together) boxes were aimed at older people in terms of supporting them to reduce loneliness and isolation during the winter. The Board also focussed on Transport and it was agreed that this should be a priority at the CP Forum. It was also agreed that funding would be ringfenced for a number of projects at local and across East Suffolk which would be considered at the next Board meeting in December.
	Nicole referred to the Annual CP Forum which, this year, would be a virtual week long event with two days focussed on the Partnerships' key priorities and she agreed to send links to the event.
	AGREED: That the update be noted.
	 ACTIONS: 1. Nicole Rickard - agreed to circulate a list of projects from the Hidden Needs Grants Programme once it closed in January. 2. Communities Team to contact Town and Parish Councils to see if they could promote the availability of the Grandpads in their newsletters. 3. Nicole Rickard – to forward links to the Annual CP Forum to CP members.
5.	Update on 2019/20 Funding
	The Partnership received a brief update on the projects funded from 2019/20 funding and Jenny C stated that it was really positive that the Partnership was beginning to pull in money from other sources to fund projects. Jo reported that the Youth Worker qualification delivered by CAS would be rolled out in January and would be offered out to other groups in the CP area to see if anyone else wanted to access that training. Reference was made to the youth group project in Southwold and it was noted that they had not yet purchased any equipment because they had only just received their funding.
	ACTION: Jo McCallum – to look into why there had been delays in the Southwold project receiving its funding.
6.	Allocation of 2020/21 Funding



	The Partnership discussed an Additional Paper circulated prior to the meeting in relation to several proposed projects for the £25,000 2020/21 funding. Jenny C suggested that if the CP agreed the proposals then two Task and Finish Groups be established, one for the Small Grants Scheme and one for the other three projects.
	AGREED: 1. That the following projects be approved:
	 Sloppy Slippers (50 pairs) = £800 Talking Benches – £500 each x up to 10 = £5,000 Voice of a Friend = £2,325 Small Grants Scheme (£500-£1,500 maximum) = £15,000
	2. That the following Task and Finish Groups be set up:
	 Voice of a Friend/Sloppy Slippers/Talking Benches – John Armstrong, Alison Ayers, Norman Brooks, Craig Rivett and Jill Tyler Small Grants Scheme – John Armstrong, Michael Ladd, Craig Rivett and Melanie Vigo Di Gallidoro

Key outcomes of the East Suffolk Community Partnership Board meeting held 7 December 2020.

1. Recap:

All eight Community Partnerships are represented on The Community Partnership Board by their respective Chairs.

The Board is currently focussed on these issues across East Suffolk:

- Transport
- Social Isolation and Loneliness
- Covid Impacts

2. Progress on Transport Priority

A Transport Task Group had met on 26.10.20 to focus on i) Active and Sustainable Travel ii) Community Transport solutions ii) Rural Transport

The Task group recommend a twin track approach to the Transport Priority: Short Term:

- Develop short-term 'quick win' deliverables.
- Identify, develop and seed/match fund pilots and trial projects to test 'proof of concept' and assess their viability to be scaled up across the area.

Medium – Long term:

- Study transport and travel issues & gaps in East Suffolk to provide rigorous data and intelligence on which to base future work.
- Work with strategic partners to redesign parts of the system, and collectively lobby to influence for change.

The Board agreed to this approach, and the Task Group has now taken the role of the Transport Programme Steering Group to help problem solve the transport priority. The three key elements for success are:

- i) The steering group now scheduled to meet 27.01.21
- ii) A programme manager who will start 01.02.21 (following an offer by EDF to provide a member of their staff to carry out the role for the Task Group)
- iii) A delivery budget the Board allocated £80k from its 2020/21 budget to fund this.

The Board also agreed to support Suffolk County Council to trial an innovative new "Katch" EV Taxi bus service between Framlingham, Wickham Market and Campsea Ashe Station from January next Year. **The Board allocated 40k** from its budget towards this trial.

3. Update on Social Isolation and Loneliness Priority

To date, a total of £135,000 had been allocated to projects aimed at tackling Social Isolation and Loneliness. In addition, £100,000 was allocated by the Board at its meeting in September for the Bounce Back Fund which, although it emanated from the Covid Impacts Task and Finish Group, has strong links to the Isolation and Loneliness theme in that it is intended to enable VCSE groups, including youth groups and community buildings, to recommence their activities safely and securely.

The Board received a brief update on the four projects funded by them to support the reduction of Isolation and Loneliness in East Suffolk:

- Hidden Needs Grant Programme
- Small Grants (Covid Community Fund),
- Grandpads
- and the VCSE Bounce Back Fund.

4. Covid Impacts Task and Finish Group Report

The Covid impacts Task and Finish Group had met again on 13th October 2020 to focus specifically on 'Vulnerable People and Places'. Having received a report from that group highlighting a range of potential needs and existing solutions, the Board agreed to:

- endorse the package of projects identified by the Covid Impacts Task and Finish Group to respond to the issue of 'Vulnerable People and Places'.
- mandate the Task and Finish Group and partner organisations to develop these projects and report back to the March Board meeting
- allocate up to £20,000 towards the EAST (Everyone Active, Supported, Together) Box project aimed at older people who live alone (or care for someone in the household) and who are vulnerable due to social isolation and/or loneliness.
