3. Current Projects Update

Sharon Harkin (SH) noted that there were no updates on current projects.

SH acknowledged that the Community Partnership's focus was currently on the priority to support the community through the rising cost of living crisis and provided a summary on work taking place through partnership organisations that supports the priorities to improve the physical health and wellbeing of primary school children and to increase physical and social activity in adults.

The Community Partnership received updates from partnership organisations on chat benches in Trimley St Mary, the Waldringfield open play space and community responders.

LB was able to confirm that East Suffolk Council's Cabinet would be considering a proposal in November 2022 to recommend to Full Council to continue Community Partnerships beyond the local elections in May 2023 and provide bridge funding to achieve this.

4. Community issues, including Youth Voice themes

There was significant discussion on the open space at Orwell Green, Felixstowe, including the skatepark. The Community Partnership received updates on plans to improve the area following SH visiting the site with East Suffolk Council to review the issues there.

SH summarised the Youth Voice responses on healthy eating. The Autumn term Youth Voice questions had been made live and responses will close on 9 December 2022. The current question set related to community safety.

ACTION – Sharon Harkin to circulate plans for improvements of the open space and skatepark at Orwell Green, Felixstowe.

6. Election of a Vice-Chair 2022/23

It was agreed by consensus that Shez Hopkins would become Vice-Chair of the Community Partnership for the remainder of the 2022/23 year.



7. Growing spaces – motion from East Suffolk Council

SH summarised the motion on growing spaces made by East Suffolk Council at its meeting in July 2022.

Mark Jepson (MJ) suggested that all representatives take the motion back to their organisations to see if there was the will to identify growing spaces and people to run them.

The Community Partnership discussed current facilities in the area and possible future opportunities, with a particular focus on establishing new allotments and solutions for the best use of excess produce.

ACTION – All representatives to take the growing spaces motion to their organisations for further discussion.

ACTION – Sharon Harkin and Mark Jepson to discuss promote community growing to schools.

ACTION – The Community Partnership will consider an update on this topic at its next meeting.

8. Cost of living and fuel crisis – what can we do?

SH summarised East Suffolk Council's "Ease the Squeeze" programme and the purpose of the exercise under this item, to review the projects offered by the programme and how the Community Partnership could support them in the area.

The Community Partnership split into two groups, one of Felixstowe representatives and the other of rural representatives, who considered the projects being offered by the programme and how they could support the Community Partnership area.

ACTION – Sharon Harkin to collate group feedback and distribute it to the Community Partnership.

At the conclusion of the task, the groups fed back on what they had discussed.

On the proposition of Mark Jepson, seconded by Mike Deacon it was unanimously agreed:



ACTION – That it be agreed in principle to allocate £15,000 of the Community Partnership's 2022/23 budget towards supporting the "Ease the Squeeze" programme.

Following further discussion, it was agreed to form a task and finish group to produce the outcome proposal to confirm the funding agreed in principle.

ACTION – Mark Jepson, Sharon Harkin, Mike Deacon and Yvonne Smart to form a task and finish group to produce the outcome proposal for providing £15,000 funding towards the "Ease the Squeeze" programme.
