Areas of innovation

Locally funded summer activity and meal programme:

- The Partnership allocated £1,500 for activities in Beccles, Bungay and Halesworth (£500 each) Town councils and parish councils have tended to contribute in the past as well
- The original idea was for the offer to be activity provision in the three towns
- After consultation with Town Councils and councillors, we decided to broaden this to offer activities and lunch

- This was to do our bit to help on holiday hunger in the area for those on Free School
 Meals as well as families that don't qualify for Free School Meals but are still struggling
- With funding from the CP, three town councils, 7 district councillors and the Beccles
 Covid food fund, we were able to offer each town 5 days of free sport and nature over
 the summer holidays and provide a free lunch to all
- We partnered with Go Geronimo, Beccles Forest School and Bushcrafters CIC to deliver the activities and local businesses (where possible) for the lunches
- 210 young people participated over 15 activity days and the activities have been well received by young people and parents
- The offering of a free lunch as well has been praised



<u>Hearts and Mind – mental health friendly towns initiative:</u>

- Our partnership allocated £15,000 (£5,000 per town) for a mental health friendly towns initiative named 'Hearts and Minds'
- We are working with Access Community Trust to provide a 6 week training programme
 to the wider community (businesses and residents) so they can feel more confident in
 being aware of mental health symptoms and triggers, having conversations about
 mental health, safeguarding and signposting
- The project was first being explored in Bungay but the Community Partnership with the Town Councils agreed to extend to all three towns
- Each town has a steering group of local organisations and people with lived experience to help steer the training programme
- Bungay has launched first with the first training session being held on 14th September
- Beccles and Halesworth will then launch Beccles and Halesworth steering groups are currently preparing for their training sessions
- Businesses and organisations that complete the training will receive a Hearts and Minds window sticker and certificate to show others that they are a mental health friendly organisation
- Training will also be recorded and shared as a free resource
- The aim for the project's legacy is that there will be 'mental health friendly organisations and businesses' in each town where local people can go for signposting and a chat

Examples

Community orchard:

- We allocated £3,250 to the Beccles Community orchard a project to convert a dilapidated site into a community growing space
- The area was cleared and is currently being assessed to see what can be grown there
- Beccles Forest School has used the site for Wild Wellbeing sessions there are further plans to introduce local people to the space
