Leiston Wellbeing Hub

- The Hub is open and being used by the social prescribing team, Turning Point, and the diabetic service.
- A launch day was being held on 20 October to advertise the hub to other groups and the community.
- Centre coordinator was now in post.
- The centre was free for VSOs to use on certain days of the week, for a pilot period of one year.

6. **CP Priorities**
