3. OPERATING SCHEDULE

3.1 The following steps have been proposed in order to promote the four licensing objectives. These are proposals offered by the applicant and in their own words. Some submissions may already form part of the licence, as mandatory conditions; others may be re-worded by officers to form meaningful, enforceable conditions on the licence.

To keep all existing conditions, except those that are currently crossed out under Annex 2 of the existing premises licence. These will be removed. To also add these conditions.

General

Only to open for 4 hours to allow night shift workers drinks before bed.

Prevention of crime and disorder

Changing condition one to Challenge 25.

Public safety

To refuse the sale of alcohol to underage.

Prevention of public nuisance

Will be closing at 11am then reopening at 3pm to allow clearance and cleaning.

Protection of children from harm

No additional conditions.

A copy of the existing premises licence and the plan that accompanies the premises licence are attached as **Appendix A & A1**.

4. REASON FOR HEARING

- 4.1 One representation against the application has been received from an 'other person'.
- 4.2 A petition against the application has been received from local residents.
- 4.3 A representation against the application has also been received from Leiston-cum-Sizewell Town Council.
- 4.4 The applicant has been provided with a copy of these representations and these are attached as **Appendix B** for members of the Sub-Committee.
- 4.5 No representations against the application were received from Responsible Authorities.
- 4.6 Summary of grounds for representation:

The main concerns are the longer licenced hours in the early hours of the morning and the possibility that this could lead to increased noise and disturbance for local residents. As well as set a precedent for other local businesses in the town. Residents already experience significant disruption in the evenings around the weekend form people exiting local premises at closing time and are concerned that this would be repeated in the early hours of the morning as well.

The local Town Council also had concerns that the extended hours would encourage antisocial behaviour, as well as wishing to protect children from the sale of alcohol on the way to school; and concerns over the health and wellbeing of local residents.

5. POINTS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 5.1 In exercising its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority has stated in its licensing policy that it will primarily focus on the direct impact of the licensable activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public living, working or engaged in normal activity in the vicinity of the premises.
- 5.2 The attention of the Sub-Committee is drawn to the following:
 - a) The Licensing Act 2003 Section 4 requires the Sub-Committee to have regard to:
 - Guidance Issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
 - The Council's Statement of Licensing Policy

If the Sub-Committee has reason to depart from the above it is asked to give full reasons for so doing.

b) Human Rights Act 1998

The Human Rights Act 1998 came into force on the 2 October 2000. The Sub-Committee is urged to have careful regard of its provisions. It is unlawful for a public authority (this expression includes local authorities) to act in a way which is incompatible with a human right.

As far as the applicant's right to a fair hearing is concerned (Article 6), the applicant has a right to be heard by the Licensing Sub-Committee. If this application is refused or granted subject to modification, the applicant has a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court.

In assessing the impact of human rights, the Sub-Committee must seek to strike a balance between the right of the proprietors in the business to conduct it as they wish and local residents who may find its activities intrusive. In this context a business is a "possession" and the human right is expressed to be for the "peaceful enjoyment" of it. A rider to this human right empowers the Council to control the enjoyment of that business by its proprietors in the general interest. At the same time, local residents are entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of their homes.

5.3 The relevant notices about this hearing have been served on the applicant and other persons and they have until 4 November 2022 to confirm that they intend to attend, or not, as the case may be and give notice that they wish to call witnesses.

6. CONCLUSION


- 6.1 The applicant has been advised of the representations that have been made and there may be mediation between the applicant and the other persons before the hearing in order to achieve agreement. In the event that an agreement is not possible, the Sub-Committee will be asked to determine this application by:
 - Granting the application subject to such conditions as are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application and any condition which must be included in the licence in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.
 - Granting the application subject to such conditions as are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application, modified to such extent as the Sub-Committee considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives (for example, by excluding a licensable activity or restricting the hours when a licensable activity can take place), and any condition which must be included in the licence in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.
 - Rejecting the application.
 - 6.2 If the decision reached by the Sub-Committee results in differences between the conditions attached to the licence and the planning permission currently in force for these premises, the applicant should be advised that the planning permission must be adhered to unless and until it is amended to reflect the conditions attached to the licence.
 - 6.3 Depending on the decision of the Sub-Committee, the applicant and / or responsible authority and interested parties that have made representations have rights of appeal to the Magistrates Court.
 - 6.4 When announcing its decision, the Sub-Committee is asked to state its reasons.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

Where a premises licence authorises the sale of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:

1. (1)No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- At any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
- At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

2. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

3. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

4. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy

applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

6. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

General Conditions

a.

Conditions imposed by JUSTICE ON-LICENCE - Licensing Act 1964, S 59, 60 and 63

1. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

- 2. In this condition, permitted hours means:
 - On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
 - b On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
 - c. On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
 - d. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
 - e. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
 - f. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
 - g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31 December).

3. The above restrictions do not prohibit:

a. the consumption of alcohol on the premises during the first 20 minutes after the above hours;

- b. the taking of the alcohol from the premises (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel) during the first 20 minutes after the above hours;
- c. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first 30 minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals;
- d. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- e. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- f. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- g. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- h. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- j. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

4. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- a. He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - b. He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - c He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is not other convenient means of access or egress.

d. The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals

General Conditions

- 1. The Licensee will ensure that an adequate and valid public liability insurance is in force and that a copy of the schedule is available for inspection by an authorised officer on request.
- 2. The Licensee will ensure that consumption of alcohol will be restricted to the areas identified on the plan attached to the operating schedule.

Crime and Disorder

- 1. The Licensee will implement the Portman Group proof of age policy.
- 2. The Licensee will ensure that all members of staff at the premises will seek PASS accredited proof of age cards, photo-driving licences or passports as proof of age evidence from any person who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises.
- 3. The Licensee will not adopt any drink promotion activities that undermine a policy of responsible drinking.
- 4. The Licensee shall implement a 'Strict No Drugs' Policy.

Public Safety

- 1. The Licensee will ensure that all exits and escape routes are clearly identified, kept free from obstruction and available for immediate use in the event of an emergency during licensable activities.
- 2. The Licensee will ensure that the edges of the treads of steps and stairways are maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 3. The Licensee will ensure that the Fire Brigade is called immediately in the event of a fire, however slight, and the details recorded in a Fire Log-Book.
- 4. The Licensee will ensure that an adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials are available on the premises.
- 5. The Licensee will ensure that outside lighting is provided and used during the hours of darkness when any form of licensable activity is taking place

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. The Licensee will ensure an 'in-built noise-limiting device' is maintained to control the level of indoor live and recorded music.
- 2. The Licensee will provide and maintain signage on the premises requesting that patrons leave the area quietly.
- 3. The Licensee will ensure the premises are properly vented, and that noxious

smells from the licensed premises are not permitted and cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

- 4. The use of the external patio area and beer garden as detailed on drawing number 2707/100/01 submitted with the above application for any licensable activity shall not be permitted after 23:30 hrs.
- 5. All windows and doors to the premises shall be kept closed at all times when amplified musical entertainment is taking place, other than for access and egress, and should be fitted with door closures.
- 6. The volume of the amplification system shall be strictly controlled so that noise levels are non intrusive at the boundaries of nearby residential properties.

Protection of children from harm


- 1. The Licensee will ensure that children under the age of 16 are accompanied at all times by an adult while they are on the premises.
- 2. The Licensee will not permit children under the age of 16 on the premises after 20:00 hrs, accept for Fridays and Saturdays for an additional hour.
- 3. The Licensee will closely monitor cigarette machine(s) & AWP's to ensure non-use by under-18s.
