The outcome of this was to develop a Rural Proofing section into the project proposals guidance to ensure that requests for project support included the need for rural communities to be considered from the outset. This focus has encouraged farer opportunities for our rural villages.</div><div><div>‘Celebration’ update presentation where all recipients of funding will feedback on progress and highlight the impact this has had on the community. Also, a look at the priorities, identify gaps and set out a work plan for 2021-2022</div></div><div><div>The CP recognise the importance of hearing the voices of young people, therefore we want to work with the high schools and youth providers to encourage project ideas from the young people in the community. The CP commissioned a survey for one of our local schools focusing on the thoughts of health and wellbeing for young people, shopping/ cooking habits of their parents and the impact this has. The results are being used to work in partnership with the INT and has resulted in the commissioning of an Early Minds mental health project delivered by Suffolk Mind and Healthy Movers project delivered by the Youth Sports Trust. Both are now being offered to all school settings within the patch. The approach means the learning can be rolled over to others</div></div></div>

The youth research will inform a local stakeholder group ('Youth Action Halesworth-Rural; YAH-R') about young people’s views of youth provision now and for the future. This will also generate learning for the rest of the patch as some themes will resonate in other wards. The oral health packs were funded, and these will include a toothbrush, tube of toothpaste, timer, information sheet (tailored for 11 year olds; provided by Community Dental Services) and a paper bag. These will be distributed in May 2022 with evaluation taking place by the end of the school term. The slipper swap builds on the success in the Carlton Colville CP area, and this will be delivered in partnership with Phil from Suffolk Family Carers.</div> <div>The Mental Health Friendly Towns initiative (named ‘Hearts and Minds’) has now been completed in Bungay, Beccles and Halesworth. Bungay received very positive feedback with 25 people regularly attending the course from across the community. Beccles and Halesworth are currently receiving feedback forms back and the Communities officer will be meeting with the provider (Access Community Trust) to discuss the project and the learning from this.</div>

		£1,223.17	Ilketshall St Andrew Village Hall (Asbestos)	<p>Follow-up events will be held in each town to celebrate the learning from the sessions and continue the conversation.</p> <p>Rural asset mapping has taken place to identify tangible and intangible assets as well as gaps and opportunities in villages and parishes. A survey with parish councils that fed into this received sixteen responses out of 23 (70%) and the remaining parish councils are being chased for responses. One key success from this exercise was more awareness of parish newsletters and the CP now has an article in the parish newsletters identified promoting the work of the CP and how local people can get involved.</p> <p>Following the January CP meeting, we set up a Task and Finish Group to home in on the themes that came up at the November workshop around physical and mental health and wellbeing. The T&FG included representation from ECCH, the Pear Tree Centre, Bungay Community Support, Everyone Active and OneLife Suffolk.
