
Community Partnership Programme

- £3,000 for Katch/Electric taxibus service approved
- Chat Bench in Great Glemham £800 approved
- FAYAP £5,050 for increased provision approved
- FAYAP £3,840 for Outreach Work in Framlingham approved
- Student Life Youth Consultation: Thomas Mills £1,000 approved
- Wickham Market Youth Outreach Provision £2,800 approved
- Small Grant Scheme £3,510 approved (Kiosk on the Hill project £2,000 and Wickham Market Football Club £1,000)

Achievements 2019-21:

Hour Community £15,000 to part fund a new Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle



- The vehicle has been used at least 4 times a week since arrival and is incredibly popular with beneficiaries and drivers.

Great Glemham Chat Bench £800



- A site has been found and the launch date is to be announced!
- Several other Parishes have expressed an interest in funding a Chat Bench!

FAYAP Youth Provision £5,050

- FAYAP was one of the youth groups identified as a priority for increased provision in the Youth Consultation which took place in September 2020
- Projects funded include:
- iRock Programme: Some amazing podcasts and films have been made by the young people, available on: www.fayap.co.uk
- Amplifier Project: 4 bands writing original material. One is playing at the Thomas Mills Prom. Concert for all 4 bands planned for the future. Numbers have increased to an average of 15 young people per week.
- Friday Night Youth Club: Great opportunity to link with young people who want to use the new Lgbt+ group as well as all the traditional benefits of a Friday night youth club. Numbers attending have increased by nearly 100%!!!!

Fayap Outreach Programme £3,840

- The funding allowed us to operate outreach work at The Pageant Field for more sessions. **5 sessions a week now take place at Pageant Field.**
- LGBTQ+ issues are coming to the fore and through our outreach we have met many young people for whom this is important and we are starting a support group for them in partnership with the High School.
- The extra outreach sessions have been very valuable in helping to tackle ASB and liaising with all the authorities and organisations involved.



Student Life Youth Consultation £1,000

- Student Life have engaged with both Thomas Mills and Framlingham College
- 15 Thomas Mills Students will lead the survey in the school, offering valuable peer-developed and peer-led consultation
- The consultation has been delayed due to school commitments post-Covid lockdown and will take place in July 2021.
- The consultation will feed into the Young People Task and Finish Group and will hopefully help to shape project need and funding for 2021-2023

Small Grant Scheme: £3,510

- The Small Grants Panel for the Community Partnership took place on 18th May 2021
- Proposals included:
- £1000 bid from Wickham Market Football Club for mobile football goal stands
- £2000 from Hour Community in Framlingham for their Kiosk on the Hill project
- Both bids were approved with conditions
