## Examples of Projects

### Hour Community - Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle

In a 6-month period –

- Over 6,000 miles were travelled
- 215 individual trips were completed
- 50% of passengers were wheelchair users
- 10 volunteers support the service

### Wickham Market - Young Adults Group

- Increase of ASB reports in the area, particularly around younger people.
- Consultation with the younger people and identified a lack in youth provision.
- 6 months of youth groups funded by the February Small Grants Scheme and the remaining 18 months being match funded by Wickham Market Parish Council.
- Working with CAS to develop volunteering, employment and training opportunities for those that attend.

# Examples of Projects

## Student Life – Mental Health, Wellbeing and Leisure Report

Over 370 students primarily from Thomas Mills High School and Framlingham College were engaged with.



### Key findings –

- Exercise, Sports, Art and gaming (video or board games) are the most popular methods in which a young person looks after their mental health
- **59%** of respondents said that they think there is mental health support available to them but they do not know much about it
- Nearly **50** of the respondents felt that there wasn't enough support available for mental health
- Over **80** of the respondents felt that leisure facilities were poor or very poor
- Over **130** of the respondents do not attend any form of local activities

# Challenges

- Covid – created new limitations on engagement and opportunities for new projects
- Local engagement and awareness raising of the Community Partnership (Parishes, Schools, Groups and Services)
- Rural proofing
- Opportunities to support
