GAMBLING ACT 2005: STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES – REVISION (CL 28/18)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. The Gambling Act 2005 came into force on 1 September 2007.
2. The Act required the Council to adopt a Statement of Principles and to update this Statement, following a consultation procedure, by January 2010 and three yearly thereafter.
3. The report presented to Licensing and Health Committee on 16 July 2018 proposed a draft statement on which to base a consultation.
4. On 9 October 2018, the Licensing and Health Committee resolved to recommend to Council that it adopts the revised Gambling Act 2005 Statement of Principles.

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1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Gambling Act 2005 replaced most of the existing law about gambling in Britain save that it does not include, within its scope, the National Lottery.
- 1.2 The Act has three core objectives:
 - Preventing gambling from being a source of crime or disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime;
 - Ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way; and
 - Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.
- 1.3 Local authorities have responsibility for publishing a three-year Statement of Principles and next revised guidance must be published by January 2019.
- 1.4 In producing its Statement of Principles the Licensing Authority must have regard to the Licensing objectives of the Gambling Act 2005 and the Guidance for local Authorities issued, and updated periodically, by the Gambling Commission.

2. CONSULTATION

- 2.1 The draft revised Statement of Principles, agreed at the July meeting of the Licensing and Health Committee, was sent out for consultation for an eight week period commencing 23 July 2018 and ending 16 September 2018.
- 2.2 The proposed changes were notified by means of:
 - The Chief Officer of Police.
 - The Responsible Authorities named in the Gambling Act 2005.
 - Persons carrying on gambling businesses within the district.
 - Groups representing vulnerable persons.
 - Parish and Town Councils.

3. RESPONSE TO CONSULTATION

- 3.1 During the consultation period the Licensing Team received just one email relating to the proposed Gambling Statement of Principles revision.
- 3.2 GamCare, a provider of information, advice, support and treatment for anyone affected by problem gambling, emailed acknowledgment of receipt of the invitation to comment. They said they were unable to read each and every draft policy but attached some flyers about their work for our reference.

4. HOW DOES THIS RELATE TO THE EAST SUFFOLK BUSINESS PLAN?

- 4.1 By giving clear guidance on licensing matters to applicants, licensees and the public; promoting economic growth for local businesses whilst enabling the community to make constructive representations should the need arise.
