SEX ESTABLISHMENT LICENSING POLICY (CL 29/18)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Suffolk Coastal District Council does not currently have an adopted policy relating to the licensing of Sex Establishments.
- 2. On 16 July 2018, Licensing and Health Committee approved a draft Sex Establishment Licensing Policy for consultation.
- 3. No responses were received during the consultation exercise.
- 4. On 9 October 2018, Licensing and Health Committee resolved to recommend to Council that it adopts the draft Sex Establishment Licensing Policy as its policy for publication on 31 January 2019.

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1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 regulates the 'Control of Sex Establishments' by Local Authorities.
- 1.2 Section 27 of the Policing and Crime Act 2009 amended Schedule 3 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 by adding a new category of 'sexual entertainment venues' alongside sex shops and sex cinemas.
- 1.3 In October 2010 Suffolk Coastal District Council resolved that the change in the law brought about by Section 27 should take effect within its area with effect from 15 December 2010.
- 1.4 Suffolk Coastal District Council does not have an adopted policy relating to Sex Establishments.

2. PROPOSAL

2.1 The proposal is to introduce a new joint policy to cover both Suffolk Coastal and Waveney District Councils which can later be adopted by the new East Suffolk Council in April 2019.

3. CONSULTATION

- 3.1 The draft revised Sex Establishment Licensing Policy, agreed at the July meeting of the Licensing and Health Committee, was available for consultation for an eight week period commencing 23 July 2018 and ending 16 September 2018.
- 3.2 The proposed policy was available to view on the Council's website alongside both the Licensing Act 2003: Statement of Policy and the Gambling Act 2005: Statement of Principles.
- 3.3 During the consultation period the Licensing Team received no comments about the draft proposals.

4. HOW DOES THIS RELATE TO THE EAST SUFFOLK BUSINESS PLAN?

4.1 By giving clear guidance on licensing matters to applicants, licensees and the public; promoting economic growth for local businesses whilst enabling the community to make constructive representations should the need arise.
