


## Mental health

Prevalence of depression is higher than the national average among patients at Saxmundham Health Centre, and significantly lower than average at Leiston Surgery







# Coastal Accessible Transport Services

## **Door to Door / Dial A Ride**

CATS operate Door-to-Door services using wheelchair accessible minibuses for the towns of Leiston, Saxmundham, Woodbridge and Aldeburgh, these journeys enable people who may need a little more assistance with their journey to remain independent, i.e., need a helping hand to the vehicle or find the walk to their local shops too far or for a journey within the same town/village.

## **Wheels within Wheels**

This service is provided by a wheelchair accessible MPV and is charged at 45p per mile plus VAT from its base at Leiston back to base. This service is ideal for journeys further afield like attending Ipswich Hospital where the volunteer driver will wait for you for up to two hours.

## **Community Car Services**

Volunteers using their own vehicles to provide journeys. The journey is charged at 45p per mile from the volunteer's home, we try and match you to your nearest driver to keep the cost as low as possible. Drivers will usually wait for up to 1 hour for shopping or appointments and 2 hours for Hospital appointments. This service is available to anyone who does not have access to a private car or are unable to use public transport.

## **Community Group Hire**

Our minibuses are available to hire to community groups and not for profit organisations.

## **Connected Communities Bus Service**

CATS operates three Demand Responsive Bus Services on behalf of Suffolk County Council for rural villages which have no regular bus service to enable you to get to your local hub or to connect to a regular bus service or train service. These services operate 6 days a week, from 7am to 7pm, can be booked by phone or online and cost the same as it would on a bus.






