SUMMARY OF NOTICE

- A valid Temporary Event Notice (TEN) has been received by the Authority.
- The premises user wishes to have a temporary bar selling alcohol. The bar is part of a private graduation party on land owned by the family of the graduation subject.
- The Notice is to allow the sale by retail of alcohol (on sales only) between the hours of 19:00 to 01:30 on Friday 1 September 2023 and 15:00 to 01:30 on Saturday 2 September 2023.

REASON FOR HEARING

- Suffolk Constabulary and East Suffolk Council's Environmental Protection Team have raised objections to the TEN given by Miss Honor Whyte (the premises user).
- Both objection notices were received within the prescribed consultation period after receipt of the TEN, as specified in the Licensing Act 2003. The police objection is based upon the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder and the Environmental Health objection is based upon the licensing objective of prevention of public nuisance.

POINTS FOR CONSIDERATION

- The system of permitted temporary activities gives the Police and Environmental Health the opportunity to consider whether they should object to a TEN on the basis of any of the licensing objectives.

CONCLUSION

- The premises user has been advised of the objections that have been made and there may be mediation between the premises user and the objectors before the hearing in order to achieve agreement and dispense with the need for a hearing.
- In the event that this is not possible, the Sub-Committee will be asked to consider the objection notices.
- It should be noted that as the TEN has not been given in respect of a licensed premises the ability to impose conditions does not apply.

RECOMMENDATION

The Sub-Committee will be asked to consider the objection notices and has the option to:

- a) Allow the licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice.
- b) Issue the premises user with a counter notice, if it decides that the event would undermine the licensing objectives.

Depending on the decision of the Sub-Committee, the premises user and the Responsible Authorities, as objectors, have rights of appeal to the Magistrates Court.

When announcing its decision, the Sub-Committee is asked to state its reasons.
