#### NCIL Overview

- Paid in instalments after commencement
- On receipt CIL automatically split into 3 statutory pots
  - 5% CIL Admin
  - 15%\* (or 25% if N Plan)
  - The rest District CIL (aka Strategic CIL)
  - \*15% cap indexed 2021 cap £149.33 per Ctax dwelling
- Neighbourhood CIL (NCIL)
  - Paid each 28 April and 28 October
  - £2.9m NCIL total October 2020
  - 5 years to spend
  - Annual Report published on PC Website and sent to <u>CIL@eastsuffolk.gov.uk</u>

#### CIL Regulation 59c – Spending NCIL

Regulation 59c of the CIL Regulations 2010 (as amended) states that the parish councils must spend Neighbourhood CIL on:

- (a) The provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or
- (b) Anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area.

#### NCIL Across Felixstowe CP

- Since April 2016 NCIL transferred to parishes in the area
- Felixstowe CP Area rec'd £162,028 up to Oct 2020
- Further potential £293,661\* due April 2021 (\*capping)
- Recently completed review of NCIL Spending in East Suffolk
- NCIL Spending so far for Felixstowe CP Area totals £52K
  - pedestrian crossing, play equip, village green posts, Grit Bin repairs, Trees H & S inspection report.
- BUT not all data publicly available, so could be more spending?!
- From April 2021 could be as much as £403,678\* being held (\*capping/and more £CIL income before 31/03/2021)
- Collaboration could mean more projects get delivered across the wider area and faster than if working in isolation parish by parish.

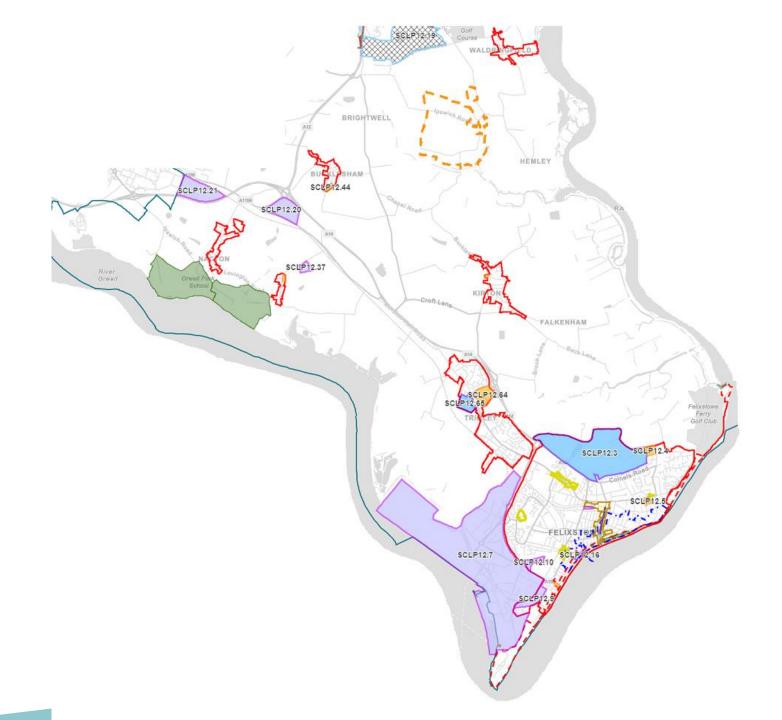

#### Spending NCIL

- Restricted by 5 years spend deadline.
- Must report (annually) by 31 December and publish to website
- Report on actual NCIL expenditure not ringfencing of sums
- How to spend NCIL quickly and effectively?
- Understand local priorities across an area some could be shared?
- Examples:
  - Improvements to Community Centres
  - New or enhanced foot/cycle routes
  - Broadband enhancements (supports education, businesses, visitors, etc)
  - Play Areas people travel locally and for visitors
  - Trim trails
  - EV Charging points at local places of interest/community use
- Collaborative spend means projects can be delivered faster and can/are more likely to attract other funding sources – grants, crowdfunding, etc

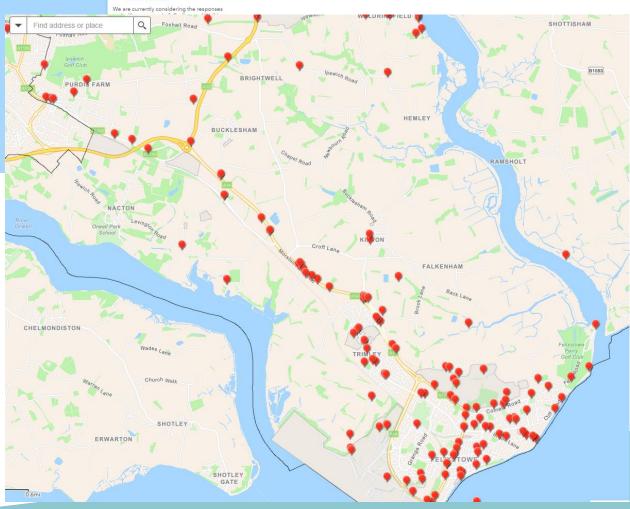
