Allocations 21/22: At the September 2021 meeting, our priorities were reviewed following an online survey we ran over the summer. It was decided to pause Budget = £28,726 (including Small Grants c/f the transport priority as wider work is being from 2020/21) done around this which we can feed in to and then we can focus on two priorities. **Community Projects (Outcome Proposals):**

> Successful summer activities took place in all three market towns – this was funded by the CP, **Enabling Communities Budgets and Town** Council contributions. In total, there were 15 days of activities that took place with a free lunch provided to young people – 220 young people in total attended and very good feedback was received from young people and parents.

> The Mental Health Friendly Towns initiative (named 'Hearts and Minds') has been completed in Bungay. Very positive feedback was received with 25 people regularly attending the course from across the community. Out of this, a mental health monthly drop in has already been set up with the space being offered for use by one of the attendees who owns a business in the town. Halesworth's course is starting at the Pear Tree Centre in January and Beccles is commencing in early February at Hungate Church.

Cheque presentations have taken place to the small grant recipients

At the September 2021 meeting, around £11,000 was allocated to different projects including ringfenced money for half term activities for young people in the three market towns, nature sessions for older people and a long Covid project

Voice of a Friend (VOF) started through the HBNA Covid response in Lowestoft. With CP funding, this was passed to NESCAB in October 2020 with 85 clients wanting a regular befriender and 9 volunteers passed over to NESCAB. Since then, another 19 referrals for VOF were made via Communities team's HBNA referrals. Urgently need more volunteers for NESCAB as some clients on waiting list and clients being prioritised, numbers engaged in befriending are less than at handover

VOF project has extended into Carlton Colville, Kessingland, Southwold & surrounding Villages with funding from the CP for that area.

Lowestoft Mile approved by the CP. 4 walks filmed and launched March 2021, 5th walk has been filmed awaiting editing. Residents voted for a boat ride near Lowestoft bridge through to Mutford Lock and Broads. Linked with local historian Ivan Bunn and used professional voice over for local historic and educational information. Film still being edited but hoping for promo video being ready for 6th December.

Lowestoft CP purchased two domains, one Lowestoft Mile and one East Suffolk Mile so other CPs can use the same format. Walks initially cost £1000 but re negotiated down to £850. As website domain bought by Lowestoft CP, all proposed walks/formats to go through Lowestoft first – domains last 2 years currently.

Initial round of decisions on grant applications made by the funding panel in December 2020.

Funding agreed for: Eyke Village Hall, Campsea Ashe Village Hall, Woodbridge basketball area, Blaxhall play equipment, Woodbridge Sea Scouts, Just 42 and Shottisham play equipment

April 2021 CP meeting agreed to continue with grant scheme for 2021/22. Launched on the 26 April 2021 and closed on the 1 June. Funding panel met on the 16 June 2021.

The Panel reviewed applications and appraisals received for the two categories of Village Hubs and Youth Engagement, before deciding how much to allocate to each.

Youth Engagement, Opportunities and Services - the following were agreed by the grant panel: Youth engagement in Elmhurst Park, Wildlife for Kids, Just 42 Compass Mentoring, Back to Scouting, Shottisham play equipment and outdoor shelter.

Village Hubs – it was agreed to fund the following: lighting and security cameras for Alderton Village Hall, wheelchair friendly picnic equipment for Hollesley Recreation Ground, Sutton Bee Keeping Club, refurbishment of Eyke Village Hall.

Second round of grants launched on the 1st November for remaining amount of £7780 funding. Closes on the 1^{st of} January. Woodbridge Youth Engagement / Woodbridge

Play Area Upgrade / Shottisham Parish Council: Provide playground equipment for the very young.

Churchyard Shelters (Young People) - Parochial Church Council of St. Mary, Woodbridge: Purchase two large outdoor shelters to facilitate activities/events despite the weather and in case a future Covid wave strikes - primarily to support younger people but for use by whole community
